

# Editorial Note

As the editor of the Iranian Journal of Electrical and Computer Engineering (IJECE), I am honored and pleased to welcome our respected readers to the first issue of this new journal.

Publication of new journals always has its hopes and challenges. On one hand, the ever-growing trend of technical research and scientific articles worldwide suggests that the journal can attract interested authors to submit their professional manuscripts for possible publication. On the other hand, the existence of numerous peer refereed journals, both in printed materials and electronic media, in every branch of science and technology makes the competence for attraction of professional readers and authors so hard. The difficulty of this task normally increases when the journal is organized to be published in developing countries, such as Iran. However, the ease and facilities that such journal provides for the publication of articles submitted by professionals from developing countries, especially local researchers; at least partly compensate this inequity and helps the balance between the hopes and challenges.

In the first year of the third millennium, i.e., 2001, which was named as the year of dialogue among civilizations by U.N., when we started the work for publication of this journal, the aforementioned challenges were our major anxiety. Until this date, IJECE has received 48 manuscripts submitted by 102 authors from 21 countries in America, Asia, Australia and Europe. First, I should appreciate the authors who submitted the results of their research. Even the authors that despite the beneficial concepts or some interesting results in their manuscripts, we had to reject their submission to fulfill the quality standard of the IJECE and to respect its policy for the publication of only high quality research papers.

Furthermore, I should express my gratitude on behalf of the IJECE editorial board to our wonderful distinguished referees who kindly accepted our invitation for reviewing the papers; in spite of their hard engagement in research and other academic or professional work. We really were benefited greatly from their invaluable expertise and I

personally have been the witness of the impact of their valuable comments and suggestions on the enhancement of the final version of submitted manuscript which are partly presented in this issue. Even I want to thank the scholars that politely rejected our invitation for paper review, because of their other engagements and the limited time period that we consider for the review process but they asked us to return to them for reviewing other papers in future or expressed their supports and good wills and best wishes for IJECE.

The continuation of this success and the rise of this trend will not be possible or even be supposed without the co-operations and contributions of potential authors, referees and readers of IJECE. I do hope from bottom of my heart to be witness of their uprising strong supports in near future.
